



Message from the Chairman of the Board

Several years ago the Executive Committee of the Southeastern California Conference and the Educational Department began to plan for a boarding academy in Southeastern California. This boarding academy was to be a place where young men and women should all learn to work at some useful occupation. Agriculture was to be the ABC of their education and industrial training of different types was to form a very active part of their school curriculum. It was the plan of the founders of this academy to follow the blueprint as outlined to us by the servant of the Lord for our educational work. Several buildings have already been constructed and the school has been in operation since September of 1949.

The original ranch consisted of one hundred acres. In order to provide additional work for students, the Nelson ranch adjoining our academy on the north was purchased, adding another fifty acres. At a recent Board meeting the June Chafe ranch, adjoining our property on the south and west was purchased. This ranch consists of ninety-three acres with about thirty acres in citrus and deciduous fruits. We feel that this additional land will be a real blessing in providing work for our students so that they can help defray the expenses of their education as well as provide housing facilities for the faculty.

We expect additional housing facilities for teachers and a home economics and science building with additional classrooms to be erected in time for the opening of school this Fall. Just as soon as funds permit, the library, music building, and an assembly hall will be erected, and plans are under way for the construction of a chapel to serve as a church home for the students as well as the people of the community.

The Board is anxious that this school shall be a great blessing to the young people of our conference in fitting them for their life's work and in preparing them for a place in God's kingdom. Your support is anticipated and appreciated.

at San Pasqual Academy.

With the foregoing considerations in mind it is only natural to conclude that true education is coming into its own and that the future training of our youth will be both adequate and complete.





The modern dormitory residences are attractive throughout, and each student room with its adequate matching furniture makes a perfect setting for the formation of lifelong friendships.








